Senior Pastor's Report

Pastor Kendall Koenig



2019 was a year of strong continuity along with small important shifts that allowed Light of Christ's ministry to thrive in new ways. Together with that, work on our new campus began in earnest, setting us up for a dramatic new future at the end of 2020. This was truly a significant year.

The Council set the following goals for 2019.

1) Embrace the vision of being "A Church of all ages" that lives out Christ's mission in this community and beyond, developing strategic plans across congregational areas (worship, ministry, staffing, and technology) for growing into those gaps and begin implementation of those plans.

That is a tall order and it has been the focus of Council and staff now for a few years. Here are some of the steps we have taken in 2019 to live into that goal and focus. We continued our **Worship** Visioning process, making small tweaks to our worship experience, seeking to focus the worship service on our core elements: Scripture, sacraments and music. Through moving the announcements to the end, streamlining the offering, and adjusting lighting we have sought to create a truly engaging, streamlined and focused worship experience welcoming to all. We also made a few important **Ministry** shifts. This year we consolidated our midweek children and youth programming, creating Wednesday Night Live, and added a dinner experience. This has created great synergy and became a place for kids and parents to connect in new and deeper ways. In response to the significant growth in AWANA, we added a part-time coordinator (**Staffing**) position to assure that kids and leaders' experience was high quality. We also made a few key **Technology** shifts this year, providing RightNow Media for all members, so that they could access high quality, spiritually grounded media content through the week. We also updated our outdated computers so that we could stay relevant with current needs, and just at the end of year, shifted our LOC App platform to provide a more updated experience. All of these small but significant shifts were an effort to live our mission to Invite, Nurture and Serve, and grow into the vision of being "A Church of all ages".

- 2) Begin planning and search for expanded staff in preparation for our move to Light of Christ's new campus. The Council formed a Call Committee that began the search process for our new Associate Pastor (*Pr. Sharon announced that she would be stepping down from FT ministry July 2020, though we have asked her to continue in a PT role through the end of this year and potentially beyond).* The Call Committee completed the Ministry Site Profile in May and awaited names from the wider church. They were slow in coming so a variety of networking and outreach efforts were initiated. Initial conversations with a few potential candidates have begun. We hope to bring a name forward to the congregation in the first quarter of 2020.
- 3) Finalize plans and launch endowment fund to sustain Light of Christ's long term mission in this community and beyond. We ran into a few challenges with this effort as the Northern Illinois Synod recommended some significant changes to the constitutional language that we have adopted for this effort. We hope to clarify that early in the new year.
- 4) Move Forward in Faith towards our new campus, finalizing construction drawings, beginning the building process and continuing to cast vision to inspire current commitments and invite new ones so that funding is strong. While we received overall approval from the Village in March for our updated plans, they raised new issues through the summer that delayed the start of construction until October. During that time, we completed the sale and leaseback of 100 Hanson Road to Renacer Church. Construction progress was slowed because of rain and snow, but footings and foundations are in. Much work continues among teams at LOC, finalizing Audio/Visual/Lighting/Acoustics and interior design and furnishings. Tentative timeline has us moving in late fall. Our new space will be a beautiful and effective space to invite our neighbors into an encounter with Jesus and an experience of community.

As we look ahead, 2020 will be a year of dramatic transition with a new Associate Pastor coming (at some point!) and moving onto our new campus and into our new Church/Ministry Center and Preschool. Our core values and commitments and culture will stay the same, but much else will grow and change. Let us stay focused on the mission that God has given to us, and boldly follow where our Savior leads.

Church Council President's Report

As we launched into the Council year, Pastor Kendall suggested we read through a book that he and Pastor Sharon had run across that speaks to the challenges of leading ministry in the 21st century. Council has often used outside resources to help frame our conversations and provide a context for the issues we discuss. "Canoeing the Mountains, Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory" compares 21st century ministry leadership to the Lewis and Clark expeditions; going where no man (or woman) has gone before! The metaphor, and lessons learned, were appropriate as the role of Council is to discern the best ways to navigate missional clarity in a rapidly changing world.

At last year's annual meeting, Pastor Sharon announced her decision to step away from full time ministry leadership in July of 2020. In February, we launched a Call Committee led by Bonnie Cummins to begin the task of compiling our ministry profile and search criteria. While we could never actually replace Pastor Sharon and all that she contributes to LOC, we are seeking God's guidance for the next right leader to help us grow into this phase of ministry.

The majority of this Council year was spent on various issues related to the move to our new ministry center. Much of this three-year term for me has felt like déjà vu; revisiting issues with the Village we thought we had resolved years, even decades ago. It seemed like things were never really going to move forward. And then in April we were presented with an offer...then there were three (thanks to our 100 Hanson Road team; Jaki Berggren, Tiffany Garcia and Gloria Jenson)! In June we held a Congregational meeting and voted to approve the sale of 100 Hanson Rd. to Iglesia Del Pacto Evangelico

Renacer, our new landlords. And shortly after, in an August Congregational meeting we voted to approve the securing of a mortgage for the new property. And after complaining things weren't moving fast enough, I found myself now having trouble catching my breath!

God provided more of a reprieve than I bargained for. In reviewing my notes, I ran across this bullet point: "Target of July 22 for dirt to be moving at the Longmeadow location". The complexity of the Village approval process delayed that significantly, but we are officially moving dirt and working hard to make up the time. I cannot express the Council gratitude strongly enough for our amazingly gifted and faithful Building Team members (Keith Sharlog, Mark Hippler, Rich Bunke, Wes Walker and Cindy Kordecki) and Business Management Team (Marty Holmberg, Jamie Walrack, Adam Cox, Hans Gustaf Ted Orzehoskie and Vicki Barmore). We would not be where we are without their faithful, competent and steady guidance, willing to "rework the plans" at a moment's notice (literally). The words, "Thank You" seem quite inadequate, for our mission has been made possible by your selfless sacrifice.

As I "pass the baton" for the second time, I do so with great confidence and hope. You have elected some of the finest people I have ever had the pleasure of knowing. While I was the veteran these last three years, I have learned so much from my Council brothers and their vision and passion for the future of mission in this place—LOC is in good hands. I count it among my greatest blessings to have had the privilege of leadership, for such a time as this.





Church Council Secretary's Report

Light of Christ's 2019 Council met on a monthly basis and, on occasion, for special meetings to address additional items. The meetings began with prayer, sharing God sightings and a devotional given by one of the Council members.

Council meetings are God-led with trust that He guides our discussions and decisions. Typical meetings included items such as reviewing and approving the prior month's meeting minutes, reviewing and approving the Treasurer's report, staffing and ministry updates, strategic planning and new ways to fulfill our mission.

Council oversees and approves LOC practices, focusing on "what does it mean to be a Lutheran church in a mission field" and how we address "discipleship" in our community, so that we continue to invite, nurture, and serve. We also addressed timely issues, such as, The Forward in Faith Capital Campaign, new church building plans, Sale of the 100 Hanson Road property, charters for new and existing teams, special serving events, the LOC Preschool, stewardship plans, and the annual budget.

RESOLUTION: "WHEREAS the Light of Christ Lutheran Church ("Ministry") proposes to borrow the sum of \$4,000,000.00 from the Mission Investment Fund of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America under the following conditions: the loan proceeds are to be used for the purpose of building a new church, the loan is to be secured by a first mortgage, or first lien deed of trust or other security instrument, on the real property of the Ministry, specifically the church buildings and grounds as well as the personal property of the Ministry, the loan will be for a term of 25 years at an interest rate to beadjusted every 5 years, and it is

RESOLVED that the Ministry is authorized to borrow the sum of \$4,000,000.00 from the Mission Investment Fund of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, to be used for the foregoing purpose and to be secured by real property of the Ministry as set forth above; the President and/or any Vice President of the Ministry are authorized to execute the promissory note and mortgage, or deed of trust or other security instrument, to evidence said borrowing, with such changes in those documents as such officers of the Ministry may approve, those officers are also authorized to take all further actions and execute all such further documents as may be necessary to carry out the foregoing borrowing; and those officers are also authorized to agree to any extensions in the payment dates or due dates under that promissory note as are acceptable to the Fund."

Motion was made to accept the resolution by Cate Welk and seconded by Mary Jane Stoner. Congregation filled out ballots, Council Members collected and tallied. Results are as follows:

New Building Team

Keith Sharlog

2019 has been a very active year for the new building team, with many ups and downs along the way. Some of the most significant events/activities include:

- Continued refining the layout and site development from the 2018 re-design, communicated Sept 13, 2018 in Town Hall
 Meeting
- Ongoing work on drawings to secure bids from subcontractors, getting the project back within our budget
- Engaged with the Village of Algonquin Committee of the Whole to answer questions on the project, and respond to neighbors issues
- Submitted for site development permit in July 2019
- Had to complete a Rusty Patch Bumble Bee and Northern Long Eared Bat survey to address Section 7 Endangered Species Act to receive approval from the Illinois Department of Natural Resources
- Redesigned the cul de sac at the end of Richmond lane to a hammerhead style, saving over \$50K
- Received site development permit from the Village of Algonquin on October 2 (after 3 month delay) and began earthwork excavation on October 6
- Received building permit from the Village of Algonquin on November 26, 2019
- Extremely wet fall weather caused soil issues, leading to a soil stabilization change order to keep work moving forward through the winter (additional cost covered by allowances and contingencies)
- Design Team formed and working very hard to decide on color schemes, room layouts, furniture, fixtures, equipment, etc.
- Signed contract with Audio Visual Lighting Acoustics (AVLA) firm to secure interior lighting and sound, with strong support from Tech and Production teams
- Footings and foundations completed December 30, and structural steel delivered January 6

Still much to do in 2020, including need to secure sign permits, final life safety sign off by Carpentersville fire department, finalize color schemes, as well as furniture, fixtures, equipment and flooring, complete many, many inspections, and work to receive occupancy permit. Keep all the involved teams in your prayers, as we continue to move this project toward completion.

MIDDLE SCHOOL MINISTRY

PATH Confirmation Ministry: 2019-2020: 67 students, 37 leaders. School year enrollment for PATH 2018-2019 was 62 students accompanied by 36 leaders. PATH met from 6:30pm-8:00pm. Volunteers help with check-in and a volunteer a administrative assistant helps with recording, worship reflections and serving reflections. The 2019-2020 focus is Knowing God. Pr. Sharon is the lead teacher, with Pr. Kendall, Jared Skorburg, and Kim Carrera each teaching several lessons throughout the year.

PATH Retreat 2019: 45 students and 34 leaders attended this annual weekend retreat with the theme of "Ascend: Set your mind on things above", based off Colossians 3:2. We studied The Lord's Prayer. We stayed at Lake Geneva Youth Camp in Wisconsin.



PATH Serving Events: During the course of the year, the PATH students assisted with Saturday Serves for LOC, Northern Illinois Food Bank in Geneva and serving Feed My Starving Children. In December, they helped decorate the church for Christmas and made angel ornaments for the LOC Preschool Angel Tree. The Feed My Starving Children event in January was for all grades along with their families, 48 students and families helped pack 262 cartons which provided 56,502 meals. This will feed 155 children for a year. The 8th graders went to the Northern Illinois Food Bank in Geneva in February and labeled cans of corn, providing meals for hungry neighbors in northern Illinois.

PATH BASH: 52 students participated with their leaders in a long day of fun filled spiritual growth and team building activities. Small groups began the day on a fun scavenger hunt. Following the hunt, there were team building activities, dinner, worship and a powerful message from Kim Carrera around searching, finding, and following God.

PATH Fun Day: In September, we had our Family Fun Day Event. A day for PATH students, parents and leaders to come have some fun with their small groups and get to know each other better, there were 50 people in attendance.



PATH Parent Night: 15 parents attended our first LIFE EVENT entitled, "Help My Kids Are Growing Up Different Then I Did." We had a Licensed Clinical Social Worker and owner of BZA Behavioral Health, Jessica Zaucha and Sarah Wilson, Pastor and Social Worker, speak to the parents about the unique challenge that parents face today.

Rite of Affirmation of Baptism: Following Faith Expression presentations, 17 eighth graders affirmed their baptism at two confirmation services in May.

Summer JAM: An average of 14 middle school age students attended. Kim Carrera and several high school assistants led the weekly devotions, games and activities to strengthen spiritual growth and give students opportunities to make new friends.

HIGH SCHOOL MINISTRY

Summit Youth Group: In 2019 Summit saw a lot of new faces. Summit had an average of 34 in attendance, 64 youth attended Summit 3 times or more. Summit has 8 adult leaders. We are using a curriculum from GROW. Some of the series talked about the importance of friendship, putting others first, practicing spiritual disciplines, and worshiping the one True God.

Plunge: Sunday afternoon Bible Study is a place, where teens plunge deeper into God's word as they fellowship with each other. Right Now Media has been a new way to engage lesson in Plunge. Every few months it is student led. Plunge averages 8 students each week.

Winter Retreat 2019: In January, 22 students along with 4 leaders went to Lake Geneva Youth Camp in Lake Geneva Wisconsin for a weekend retreat. The theme of the weekend was "ID." They grew in their faith as they learned the importance of having their identity in Christ and Christ alone.



Mission Trip: 48 high school students, 2 college aged student leaders and 8 adult leaders went to Leech Lake Reservation in Minnesota, in partnership with YouthWorks. The theme for the week of serving was "Storyline". Psalm 23:6 was the theme verse that the students lived out. They were split into multiple work crews as they served the community of Leech Lake. They served in many ways; at a kids program, landscaping, at a community garden and scraping and painting families helped pack 164 cartons which provided 35,424 meals a playground. 58 people were God's hands and feet as they were learning that God has given each a unique storyline. 2 youth and Kim Carrera shared in the weekend worship message focused on the serving that was done and life transformation experienced. The students also led music for the LOC congregation the weekend of the mission trip message.

Summer Summit: We spent this summer connecting through fellowship and learning nights. The summer began with an 8th grade welcoming and summer kick-off event. Throughout the summer the group enjoyed Family Feud Night, Mission Impossible Night, and our annual Messy Game Night. We had our first Summit Olympics, that was organized and run by 2 Summit students. A worship and open mic night was an event where we heard how God is working in students' lives. It was a powerful night of sharing and worshiping through many forms. Also this summer, we went through a series called "More Than a Hashtag," as we explored the injustice that we are surrounded by. We were challenged to not just post on social media but to do something, act justly, and walk humbly in this world as believers. We had a Lock-in towards the end of summer where 33 high school students enjoyed a night of fun with no sleep.

Fall Scavenger Hunt: In the fall, 31students and 7 leaders loaded cars and used team work to solve dues and make their way across, Crystal Lake, Lake in the Hill and Algonquin. It was an amazing night where teens were able to make some new connections with other students. Team building was at the core of the night.

Serving Joyfully: Summit partnered with PATH students to host a food drive in the spring with donations going to FISH food pantry. In the fall collected donations to go to PADS of Elgin. The youth also saw the importance of serving their church family where they painted benches and picnic tables at God's Acres, a church members farm. In November, Summit served at Feed My Starving Children. 43 students, leaders, and in Haiti. This will feed 97 children for a year. In 2019, 5 high schoolers served in Faithland, 3 in AWANA, and 17 for VBS. There are 2 students who helped usher this year on a regular basis. The youth also served on multiple musical teams; 2 are serving on a worship team, 4 in orchestra, and 1 on the Proclaim projection team.



Welcome Ministry Report

The Welcome Ministry experienced yet another outstanding year, thanks to the combined efforts of a Volunteer Team of over 85 Ushers, Greeters, Communion Servers, Connection Center Hosts and Coffee Station Hosts who serve faithfully. And, we are always looking to add new members —there's always room to serve as a part of the Welcome Ministry Team! Our team consists of multiple serving rotations: 2 Saturday Night teams (1st & 3rd weeks of the month, and 2 & 4th weeks of the month), and 4 Sunday morning teams (Week 1, 2, 3 & 4—with a different team at both 9am and 10:30am). We also have a group of subs who regularly step in when a schedule is "open", and one-time servers who help out occasionally (especially around Easter and Christmas).

Light of Christ had the privilege of welcoming over 100 First Time Guests in 2019. In addition, 73 people decided to make Light of Christ their church home through membership in 2019. We have continued to help connect new guests into Light of Christ through our various Welcome Ministries: Meet the Pastors, Insight: Pizza with the Pastors (New Guest Information Event), and the Membership Class.



This year, we continued to evaluate and adjust our Welcome Ministry programming to best serve people as they progressed through

different stages of connection at Light of Christ. While Meet the Pastors and Insight: Pizza with the Pastors had been working quite well for those in earlier stages of connection, we decided it was time to establish a straight forward, stand alone class for those looking to formalize their membership with Light of Christ. We simply entitled the event "Membership Class", and ensured that our marketing efforts welcomed those from all different stages of connection at LOC—to not only those just starting out at LOC, but also those who had been attending for any length of time. This proved to be a tremendous success—the response was overwhelming—and the number of people who chose to call Light of Christ "home" through membership was nothing short of humbling. These Membership Classes allowed us space and time to celebrate how God has used LOC to work in the lives of so many people, and gave us the opportunity to look ahead—together—as One Body with Many Parts—to ask God how He wants to use each and every one of us to make a difference in the lives of others. To Him be the glory!

Another change for the Welcome Ministry came in the way of establishing our first ever "Leadership Team". This team consists of 10 members of our Welcome Ministry—some ushers, some greeters, some coffee station hosts, communion servers, and connection center hosts. Contemporary Worship

In 2019, contemporary worship services continued to be held on Sunday mornings at 10:30am. Contemporary worship continued to be led by a rotation of 5 praise bands. Worship also involved the children's choir about twice a month, and occasionally added a brass section to the praise band.

LOC Worship Music Ensembles

Music ministry involved over 100 musicians in 2019. The music ensembles continue to be a substantial and effective way for musically blessed congregants to serve in worship and nurture their relationship with Jesus Christ! LoC Praise Bands include about 40 dedicated and talented musicians, including high school and college students. Adult Choir continued to build this year, performing more sophisticated literature, and contributing to worship about twice a month. The chamber orchestra grew in size and sound as it added several young brass players and contributed to the Christmas and Easter services.

Production Team, led by Jack Belford, provides sound engineering, A/V, Proclaim, and lighting expertise for all worship services. The LoC Production Team is part of the structure that strengthens the message by faithfully producing the best possible atmosphere for worship. The team's purpose is articulated in a worship song that is commonly used in LoC worship, "Holy Spirit." The chorus lyrics, written by Bryan and Katie Torwalt, are, "Holy Spirit, You are welcome here. Come flood this place and fill the atmosphere. Your glory, God, is what our hearts long for, to be overcome by your presence,

LOC Music Reaching Out

In 2019, LOC praise bands took several opportunities to reach beyond Hanson Road to affirm our church's mission and invite people into our community. In March, a band played the PATH retreat. In July, a band played the Algonquin Founders Day Parade, and in September, a small ensemble provided musical accompaniment for an immersion baptism event.

LOC Children's Choirs

Adult Ministries Report

Adult Ministry at Light of Christ offers opportunities for adults to grow in their faith, find Christian friendships with others and serve beyond themselves. We are continually encouraging adults to find places to connect in all three areas living into our Mission Statement of Invite, Nurture and Serve. The ministries below were designed to help adults grow closer to Jesus, find or grow in Christian friendships and serve in meaningful ways.

GROWING

DISCIPLESHIP WITH ADULTS

Explore God

In January and February we joined 100's of churches across the Chicagoland area to participate in the 5-week Explore God Initiative. Through sermons, devotionals and small groups we tacked the tough questions of our Christian Faith. There were 26 small groups that took this journey.

Classes

Pastor Kendall's Wednesday Morning Bible Study – This study continued meeting weekly from September through May. Pastor led the group through various books of the Bible with teaching and small group discussion.

Small Groups

Light of Christ had small groups in 2019 that dug into God's word through studying various books of the Bible, and Christian Book studies. These included men's (8 groups), women's (8 groups) and couples groups (8 groups).

Monthly

Men's Breakfast – This event continued to serve many men at Light of Christ. Meeting the second Saturday of the month offering a combination of friendship and faith growth opportunity. This year from September through December the Breakfast was held at Southern Belles, a restaurant in Carpentersville. Average attendance was between 20 -25 men. The men studies different topics with the fall study being Tim Tebow's "This is the Day" through Right Now Media.

Women's Breakfast - This event continued to serve many women at Light of Christ. Meeting the first Saturday of the month offering a combination of friendship and faith growth opportunity. Average attendance was between 15 - 20 women. They reflected different topics to address real needs that Christian women face in today's society.

Couple's Night Out – This event met the first Sunday evening of each month from October through May,

offered a combination of friendship and faith growth experience. Valentines Party and Trivia night, When Your Engine Overheats, Secrets to an Awesome Marriage, Starting and Stopping and a Christmas Party are some of the events that occurred this year.

MOPS – This ministry met the 2nd and 4th Thursday of each month between September and May, and is geared toward mothers with preschoolers. There were 25 women participating in 2019. MOPPETS is the childcare arm' of the ministry and they care for 20 children this year. A combination of "Real Life' topics with outside speakers, crafts and great conversation made for an important year.

Women's Ministry – This year the Ministry offered weekly and monthly events for the women of LOC. Some of the events were: Craft Fair, Yoga, and serving opportunity.

Men's Ministry – This year the Men's Ministry continued to offer small groups with a kick-off in the fall, a Brisket and Baggo Board Kickoff event. This kickoff was in conjunction with the Women's Ministry as the winner of the men's and women's Baggo competition, played each other. They also sponsored the serving event for Turning Point in Woodstock.

Freebirds - This is a play group for middle aged or older people who don't need childcare, and would like a moment to get away from cares and duties and just have some fun. This year they went to summer concerts, restaurants and a comedy club. We have had 30 people involved in the ministry.

Support

Griefshare - This eleven week small group was offered in the spring of 2019. It was for those going through a time of grief. There were 13 people that participated.

Hope for Parents - This is a very special weekly group offers support and encouragement to parents whose children are facing substance abuse and mental health challenges.

Discipleship

"Summer Devotionals": This summer we sent devotionals to the congregation every Monday and Thursday mornings. They were an opportunity to stay connected in Scripture and grow in their relationship with Jesus over the busy summer months.

"Christmas Devotionals": This Christmas Season we sent devotionals to the congregation every Monday and Thursday mornings. We looked at the history behind nine different Carols and then reflected on the amazing message given to us through those Carols to help us stay grounded in our faith during the full season of Christmas.

Special Events

E3: Explore, Engage, Experience – A very special weekend on February 22-24. 2019 was experienced by 78 people. This event was held at Inspiration Ministries in Walworth, Wisconsin. E3 also had a Reunion Night, Bake Sale, and lead worship the weekend of January 5/6, 2019.

Life Event - Our first of three Life Events kicked off on October 30 for PATH and AWANA Parents as well as the whole congregation. The topic was, "Help, My Kids are Growing Up Different than I Did'. We had two speakers, Jessica Zaucha and Pastor Sarah Wilson, present on this important topic. This Life Event was geared toward people in the midst of raising elementary, middle and high school children. We had 60 people attend.

Women's 2019 Retreat – "Break the Mold" – The Joy of Being Perfectly Imperfect". Fifty women of all ages took a beautiful fall weekend, November 8-10 to celebrate our imperfections and our great need for our God in our lives. The Retreat was set at Lake Delayan Resort in Deleyan Wisconsin.
